TIME TO GIVE THANKS

Thanksgiving Day is approaching, a special day set apart for giving thanks as a nation for God's blessings upon us. We will gather as families and fill ourselves with turkey and dressing, mashed potatoes and gravy, sweet potatoes and green beans, apple pie and pumpkin pie with whipped topping or a scoop of ice cream. I'm starting to get hungry just thinking about it. We will share sweet fellowship with family members (and don't forget the football game – Detroit Lions and another team who won't be at home for dinner).

While it is a special time for family gathering and thanksgiving we should be celebrating thanksgiving every day of life. For "this is the will of God." Here is just a few references about thanksgiving from the Bible.

Jonah 2:9, "But I with the voice of thanksgiving will sacrifice to you." These are the words of Jonah – while he was still in the belly of the big fish (whale?). Would we be ready to offer thanks in such circumstances?

1 Thessalonians 5:16-18, "Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you." Paul wrote this as the Thessalonians were concerned about unabated persecution and the death of family members and what would become of themselves as well. Even under such circumstances they were urged to rejoice and give thanks. Some have lost loved ones in the past year. When we are in Christ we know without doubt that we will be reunited in heaven.

1 Timothy 2:1-2 "First of all, then, I urge that supplications, intercessions, and thanksgivings be made for all people, for kings and all who are in high positions, that we may lead a peaceful and quiet life, godly and dignified in every way." November is also election time. No matter who wins the election some of us will be disappointed. But we are still encouraged to give thanks and offer our prayers for those in "high positions" even if we don't agree.

Philippians 4:4-7, "Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, rejoice. Let your reasonableness be known to everyone. The Lord is at hand; do not be anxious about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus." When Paul wrote these words of encouragement and hope he was in prison, likely in Rome, waiting to be put to death. Yet the whole letter to the Philippians was full of joy.

We are likewise called to live a life of thanksgiving, rejoicing and hope. I pray that your life will be one of thanksgiving and praise for the immeasurable blessings of God, especially for the gift of life eternal.
