From Pastor Dean's Desk

Live As Courageous Disciples!

The Church of the Brethren Annual Conference is approaching and the theme this year is to live as courageous disciples. In the Book of Philippians we see where Paul is praising the Church for the great things that are happening in the fellowship of believers. These things just did not happen by accident. These words were written to mature believers that were followers of lesus.

In Philippians 1: 20, 21 we read these words: "I eagerly expect and hope that I will in no way be ashamed, but will have sufficient courage so that now as always Christ will be exalted in my body, whether by life or by death. For to me, to live is Christ and to die is gain." As a believer we try to lead a life after the teachings of Jesus but many times we do fall short. Paul challenges us to live for Christ and not to be ashamed for what we believe.
