Title: Guidelines for Use of Kid/Youth Zone Room Date: Oct. 21, 2014

1. All events should be booked in the New Fellowship Hall. The Youth Room is not an option if the New Fellowship Hall is available.

- 2. The youth have first priority for the Youth Room. The youth advisors must be contacted and give permission for the use of the room.
- 3. The party booking the room must be an active church member.
- 4. If the Youth Room is used, the kitchen and the area adjacent to the kitchen for 3-or 4 tables is what the group should be using.
- 5. The equipment and games in the Youth Room should not be used unless prior permission is given by the youth advisors.
- 6. Any cost for damages to the Youth Room equipment and supplies will be the financial responsibility of the person reserving the room.
- 7. The room is to be set up and torn down by the person or group making the reservation. The room should be cleaned and left in the condition that it was found.

FROM THE PRESIDENT

A Community of Conversation

hen I arrived at Bethany Theological Seminary this past summer, I invited each and every member of the faculty and staff to answer three questions: When have you seen the Seminary at its best? How can we nurture the health of the Seminary community? And, what can I do to support you in your call? These three questions guided thirty-four different conversations. The shortest conversation was fifteen minutes, and the longest was nearly two hours.

I listened as friends remembered the 2004 Church of the Brethren Christmas Eve service hosted by Bethany Theological Seminary and televised on CBS, recounted past Presidential Forums with anticipation for this year's forum on Love Feast and, most important, celebrated the Seminary's teaching vocation and the quality of classroom conversations.

To nurture the health of the Seminary community, friends emphasized a healthy respect for theological diversity and an equal emphasis upon the growth and development of the Seminary's residential and distance learning programs.

In supporting each member of this community, the word listen was repeated again and again with such comments as "Listen, and when you speak, be clear." The blessing of these initial conversations is that they opened a space for conversations that continue today.

In nearly twenty years as a pastor, I learned to never underestimate the power of a relationship. Each and every conversation holds within it hope and promise. Not all conversations are easy and comfortable, but if we are quick to listen and slow to speak (Jas 1:19), there is greater opportunity for meaningful sharing and deeper understanding.

For 108 years, Bethany Theological Seminary has been a place of deep and enriching conversation. A school of academic rigor and practical engagement, Bethany has long been centered on the foundations of our faith: interpreting scripture together. discerning God's call, and following Jesus. For our graduates this has led to pastoral ministry, greater leadership in the church, advanced degrees, and deeper spiritual discernment. For all, seminary education is a deeper conversation, a blend of listening and speaking.

In nearly twenty years as a pastor, I learned never to underestimate the power of a relationship.

As president, I want Bethany Theological Seminary to be a first thought—a first thought in theological education and as a church resource.

- A first thought in theological education. Bethany serves the Church of the Brethren as its only denominational seminary. With a distinct heritage and relationship with the church, Bethany offers an education that expresses the historic values of the Church of the Brethren while preparing individuals to meet the changing needs of the world. Whether preparing for a specific call to ministry or simply discerning life's next step, there is a thoughtful conversation waiting at Bethany.
- · A first thought as a church resource. As the church continues to live in a changing world, Bethany stands as a resource for individuals, congregations, and the larger church by providing thoughtful, integrated, and theologically centered resources which reflect our common commitments. From conflict transformation to the spiritual development of adolescents, Bethany is a resource to those seeking a deeper conversation of faith and faithfulness.

I invite you to be in conversation with Bethany Theological Seminary as we continue "to lead a life worthy of the calling to which [we] have been called" (Eph 4:1b). waw



New Leadership for Today

ethany Seminary's new president Jeff Carter transitioned into his role amid the crowds and activity of Annual Conference 2013, giving many in the denomination a chance to speak with him at the Bethany exhibit, greet him in the halls, and hear his words at several events.

Now a leader in theological education among the Brethren, Carter comes to Bethany with characteristics that the Presidential Search Committee was looking for: love for Christ and the church, pastoral experience, a desire for intellectual and spiritual growth, and a commitment to building relationships within the denomination. Committee chair Rhonda Pittman Gingrich added, "Jeff also brings the necessary leadership skills to fulfill the Seminary's current strategic plan and a vision for the future."

An alumnus of the Seminary, Carter has demonstrated the importance of communication and relationship building throughout his ministry. His pastoral leadership includes eighteen years at Manassas Church of the Brethren in Virginia, the last ten as lead pastor and head of staff. His guidance in the many facets of congregational life led the Manassas church to acknowledge its needs and potential, develop an effective strategic plan, and improve its fiscal position. Carter's earlier years involved development of Christian education and youth programs with increasing experience in administration. Support of the denomination and its programs have always been of importance.

The Church of the Brethren has also tapped Carter to serve in various capacities, most notably as a member of Annual Conference Standing Committee and chair of both the

Annual Conference Study Committee on Denomination Name and the Forms Reception Committee as part of the Special Response Process. He has been a featured speaker at Annual Conference, National Youth and Jr. High Conferences, and other events. On the district level, he has

served on the Mid-Atlantic District board and as moderator.

Carter has also extended the influence of the Brethren and his own faith commitment into wider circles. In Brethren Volunteer Service at the denomination's Washington office, he represented the denomination's views and positions in collaborating with government officials and



organizations. From 2003-2010, Carter was the Church of the Brethren representative to the World Council of Churches and simultaneously served on the United States Conference of the World Council of Churches Board of Directors.

Following completion of his MDiv at Bethany in 1998, Carter earned a doctorate in ministry from Princeton Theological Seminary in 2006. In addition to articles in Messenger magazine, his publications include contributions to Feasting on the Word, a commentary series published by John Knox Press, and the essay "Worship in the Church of the Brethren," appearing in Worship Today: Understanding, Practice, Ecumenical Implications, published internationally through World Council of Churches Publications in Geneva, Switzerland.

Lynn Myers, chair of Bethany's board of trustees, notes that Carter has spoken of a gentleman who greatly influenced his decision to enter ministry. It is an experience reflected in Carter's words as he contemplates his next steps: "Bethany Theological Seminary has a unique calling as it forms individuals and a church for ministry, witnesses to God's shalom and Christ's peace, and sends forth disciples to proclaim the good news of Christ Jesus. I look forward to this new adventure in mission and ministry." wew


