Expect Great Things
2 Kings 4:1-7

One of my favorite stories of "blessing," is found in, 2 Kings 4:1-7. It seems that a certain Prophet had died, leaving his wife penniless. In the Passage we read that her situation had become so desperate, that creditors, were coming to take her sons into servitude, so she ask Elisha for help. We need to understand that, in the world, satan is "the creditor," and he, comes to steal, and to kill, and to destroy, all that you have, (John 10:10). We read in this Passage that this woman, took her problem to Elisha, God's Servant.

Elisha asks her two questions, "What shall I do for you?" and "What have you in the house?" Jesus ask the same of us. "What shall I do for you?" (Matt. 21:22, Mk 11:24-25; Jn. 14:14). She quickly answers, "a pot of oil," it was in fact all that she had. The woman didn't have much, but she trusted God's Servant. When we trust God, there is no limit to what can be done. Elisha tells her to go to all of her neighbors and to borrow as many empty vessels as possible, meaning, she was to expect great things!

What are you expecting? Are you expecting God to do great things? One of the biggest problems Christians have, is that we make God too small, and we ask for too little.

After she had gathered all the vessels she could, she was to take, what she had, the single pot of oil, and start pouring it into the other vessels. She would find that her pot, would not run dry until she had filled all the other vessels. In other words, God stops when we stop! I don't ever want to stop, because if I don't stop, He won't stop! She took of the excess oil, sold it, paid all her debts, and had plenty enough left over to live on. God has enough to supply all your needs!

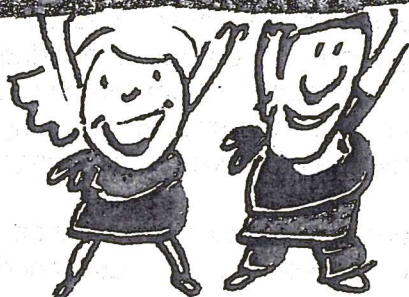
