## Acts 2:1-4

When the Day of Pentecost had fully come, they were all with one accord[a] in one place. 2 And suddenly there came a sound from heaven, as of a rushing mighty wind, and it filled the whole house where they were sitting. 3 Then there appeared to them divided tongues, as of fire, and one sat upon each of them. 4 And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak with other tongues, as the Spirit gave them utterance.

May 20 is Pentecost Sunday, which is known as The Birthday of the Church. It is an important Sunday to mark down on your calendar, mainly because God sent the Holy Spirit down to earth.

When we read Acts 2 we see what happened on the Day of Pentecost. There are significant events that we need to know. The first event is that the apostles and the devout men from every nation were there in one accord. (Acts 2:1) This means that there were no divisions within the leaders of the early church, at the time that God sent the Holy Spirit. No one could say, "I have the Holy Spirit, and you don't!"

The second event that happened at Pentecost was the Holy Spirit spoke to seventeen different people, from seventeen different nations. (Acts 2:9-11) Only God would be able to do a miracle like that! It tells us that God speaks through many different languages today! God was speaking to each one of these languages "the wonderful works of God." (Acts 2:11)

The third event that happened at Pentecost was that Peter explained to everyone that Pentecost was a fulfillment of prophecy from Joel 2:28-32. Peter said this, in order to correct some people who said that Pentecost was nothing except people who were "full of new wine." (Acts 2:13)

Whenever God is moving and doing miracles among people, you will always have people who will deny it! And the only way to prove whether something is from the Holy Spirit or not, is to back it up with scripture. Peter did exactly that before the critics.

The fourth event that happened at Pentecost was that Peter preached the Gospel Message before some of the Jews who did not believe that Jesus is Lord. The result of Peter's sermon was that some of these Jews were "cut to the heart." (Acts 2:37) Peter gave these people the opportunity to repent and get baptized in the name of Jesus Christ. That way, they would receive "the forgiveness of sins, and receive the gift of the Holy Spirit." (Acts 2:38)

The fifth event that happened was that "three thousand souls were saved" at the time of Pentecost. (Acts $2: 41$ ) This is the reason why some churches hold baptisms on Pentecost Sunday. This is being obedient to what the scriptures tells the churches to do!

All of these events at Pentecost point us to the power of the Holy Spirit! And this is the reason why we should honor this important day on the church calendar! God gave us the Holy Spirit, in order for us to receive this miracle, and how God used the Holy Spirit to begin and grow the church!

On October 8, 2016, Hurricane Matthew hovered over Edgecombe County and most of Eastern North Carolina dropping about 14 inches in rain in parts of the County. Flash flooding occurred all over the County during the storm. Immediately following the storm, creeks flooded, and within a few days, the Tar River Flooded. At the Tarboro Town Bridge, the Tar River crested at 36.2 ft , just a few inches short of the historical record set after Hurricane Floyd in 1999 of nearly 42 ft .

Doing disaster relief is one of my favorite things to do for several reasons. One is obviously helping those that are in need and do not have the means to rebuild their houses. Another is the social aspect of it all. What I mean by that is the relationship building that goes on when many come together to meet a common goal. From the church groups, to the Disaster Organizations, to the homeowners themselves. All are bound in this unique community of rehabilitation and healing.

From Myerstown COB there were six of us who went: Earl Liskey, Ken Liskey, Susie Dundore, Ken and Amelia Gross, and me (Melissa Wilson). For the Brethren Disaster Ministries (BDM) usually we are housed by ourselves and a construction leader from BDM lead us in what to do with the houses. BDM was in transition that week to a new site, so we went as representatives for them to work with the Methodist in Torboro NC.

Our housing was an old hospice center converted into volunteer housing. It consisted of multiple kitchens, bunk beds area for men and women, and several different dining rooms. The women had four showers inside and the men drew the short stick with the showers being outside. It is great we had all this space because we shared it with two other groups.

Each day we had a scrumptious breakfast from Susie at 7 am , devotions, and out on the site by 8 am . In the evenings, after taking much needed showers, we would play cards, sight see the historical district, watch tv, or compete in ping pong challenges. On Wednesday one of the local churches invited us to have dinner with them where we enjoyed a wonderful meal and fellowship time.

At first our group was paired with two electricians and worked on finding wires and putting in electrical boxes. As the week went on, we were moved to a different house and fixed electrical boxes, put insulation in, and started on scraping the popcorn ceiling off. Talk about a challenging and messing job! We ended the week hanging dry wall and prepping for the finishing work on it.

In short, it was a tiring but enjoyable week. We learned new skills, reused old ones, and had a lot of fun. I would highly encourage anyone to join us next time. No matter what your skills are, there is always work to be done.
