a. Ministry & Evangelism – Steve Krick

A Board Retreat, focusing on spiritual renewal and goal setting was proposed and initial planning was in progress. The Retreat had to be postponed due to the inability to come up with a date suitable to a majority of the Board. We continue to contact potential commission members. We ask that anyone interested in serving on the commission contact a member of the commission for more information.

It was decided to keep Pastor Marty in charge of the worship leaders. In pastor Marty's absence, Steve Krick filled the pulpit on May 6th.

We had planned to host Harvest America on June 10. After looking closely at the program and the planning required to host a successful experience, we decided to aim for 2019. We are in contact with "On Fire" to possibly hold it in their facility in 2019. The Youth expressed interest in viewing this year's program in the Youth Zone.

Bill Litman will fill the pulpit on July 8 while Pastor Marty is at Annual Conference. Teen Challenge Choir will provide their program on July 15th during the morning worship service.

We decided to contact "Piercing Word" as a program. Grace did contact them to select a date for the program titled "Romans Highlights". This will be held October 21, 2018.

"Traditional Sound", a local Christian music duet, is being considered for a future music program.

The evening of music is being planned for Saturday, Sept. 15th. We are working on a participants list.

b. Missions & Fellowship – Susie Dundore

The commission is working on many projects.

We raised \$125.00 from the Easter breakfast, for the Londonderry Village wishlist. \$750.00 from our Mission Fund was given for the Brethren Disaster Relief trip to Tarboro, NC to pay for expenses. The trip was April 15 through 21, 2018. 6 people responded to help people rebuild their homes from Hurricane Matthew in 2016. We were helping the United Methodist Church.

We collected jewelry, handbags and other items for Londondderry Village yard sale which was May 31, June 1 and 2. It was very successful.

The chicken bbq at Londonderry Village is July 27 and 28. Churches are asked to bake 15 dozen Snickerdoodles. We are working with Women's Fellowship on getting together to make the cookies.

We are organizing a theme basket for the basket Auction. Our theme is "Myerstown" and we are collecting items from Myerstown companies.

June 11th was ELCO Middle School award program. We are happy to say that we gave 5 Good Neighbor Awards to students at the school. Each student was given a framed award and a gift card to J.O.Y. Bookstore.

We are looking into C.V.L. (Church Video License). The cost of this is \$135.00 a year. It is a Christian movie company. This license can be used for fundraisers, youth projects, movie nights or other ideas.

We are working on a reception in the "Gathering Place" after the worship service on July 15th by Teen Challenge.

July 25th is Christmas in July at the Susan Dowhower House. There will be a list of residents names for presents. We play BINGO and have refreshments.

The mailboxes were updated and we are also revising the "Welcome Packet". We are busy working on other projects for the future.

Sharing Cupboard – Dorothy Nagle

We would like to once again thank everyone for the generous support of our Sharing Cupboard by donating food and monetary contributions over the last few months.

Thanks to all the volunteers and we are still looking for volunteers to help load and unload our orders from Horning's 1 day a month (always a Tuesday at 9:00 a.m.) which takes less than 1 hour.

During the months of March through May we averaged 83 families per month, being open 4 days a month.

A few months ago we had a donation of celery from a truck driver. He had 400 cases of celery (14 stalks to a case) that he needed to get rid of. We took 10 cases and he asked whether we know anyone else that would take the rest. We contacted Horning's Market and they took the remaining cases. Horning's donated \$1,000.00 to the cupboard for the celery, which they gave as credit for the groceries we buy each month. We also received a donation of \$270.00 for the celery from the Elizabeth Food Market.
