Our Spiritual Renewal Services with James Myer was held October 7 to October 10. Jim Myer officiated Love Feast and Communion on October 7. Average attendance was 71 people. The offering for the four nights was \$1,229.00. It will be given to Brethren Disaster Relief for the hurricane victims in the Carolinas. A special thanks to Earl Liskey for coordinating the music.

We decided to combine the Praise and Worship Night with the Night of Gospel Music held on September 15. In response to positive comments and requests for similar programs, we decided to plan for another Night of Gospel Music. We have set a date of March 9, 2019.

After 64 years, the radio broadcast, "The Brethren Hour", will have its final broadcast on December 31, 2018. Thank you to Ken Wagner for his support and coordination of the program.

In response to numerous requests from the congregation, the commission decided to have a Children's story twice a month.

A change to the Youth Sunday schedule is that they will be in charge of the service on Sundays when Pastor Marty is unavailable.

"Piercing Word" will present their program titled "Sermon on the Mount: the Musical" on Sunday evening, October 21 at 7 PM. A free will offering will be taken and donated to "Piercing Word".

b. Missions & Fellowship – Susie Dundore

It was a busy summer with different activities.

5 students from the ELCO Middle School received the "Good Neighbor Award". They received a gift card from J.O.Y. bookstore and a certificate for good deeds through the school year.

Our commission works directly with the treasurer, counts offerings each Sunday and meets monthly at commission and board meetings.

MCoB now has access to e-tithing through Fulton Bank since August 2016. The bank plan we joined allows up to twenty direct payments a month.

We are currently looking into different options to redo the mortgage for the building fund and bring down our monthly payments. This has or will be explained shortly.

With other reductions the negative in our budget is approximately \$55,000.

Approved by motion, second & aye vote to the amended budget as proposed by Bob Noll and suggestions by other members of the congregation. The total budget for 2019 is approximately \$197,000, which does not include the Building Fund.
