a. Ministry & Evangelism – David Dubble

The "Piercing Word" program was well received and will be considered for a future event.

Much time was devoted to planning the Night of Gospel Music being held on March 9, 2019. Special thanks to Grace Ziegler for the time she devoted to contacting participants for the program.

The idea of having a membership meal and to have attending members invite a friend or family to attend was is under consideration. A program would follow the meal.

Commission appointments for 2019 were completed.

It was decided that the Children's story will be held on the 2nd and 4th Sundays of the month starting in January 2019.

Chris Smith, pastor of the Mt. Zion Church of the Brethren, has agreed to do our Spiritual Renewal services to be held on October 6th through October 9th, 2019. This will also include Love Feast to be held on October 6, 2019.

A congregational survey instrument was created and distributed to the membership. Approximately 50 surveys were returned. Commission members and a ANE District representative have reviewed the surveys and will be meeting with Pastor Marty to discuss input from the surveys and to develop a plan for moving our church forward. An especially strong response from the surveys indicated the desire and need for Spiritual Revitalization.

The Christmas Eve program was a very successful event. Thank you to all who participated and attended.

Linda Zimmerman has volunteered to be our church delegate for annual conference this year.

The Music Committee has suggested that on the second Sunday of the month members of the church who play instruments play some selections during the service. This is being considered.

Pastor Marty has asked for permission to have a prayer concern box placed in the Gathering Place or sanctuary for people to use. We are looking into this.

#### b. Missions & Fellowship - Susie Dundore

#### e. Finance & Stewardship – Andy Heisey

Our commission works directly with the treasurer, counts offerings each Sunday and meet monthly at commission and board meetings.

McoB now has access to e-tithing through Fulton Bank since August 2016. The bank plan we joined allows up to twenty direct payments a month.

Please see me if you need a direct payment form. No service fee is charged to members for this service. It is quick and easy to sign up.

The Debt reduction ended with contributions of \$93,529. Bringing the remaining amount owed down to \$84,453. After the modification was made the payments went from \$5,860 to \$1,645 a month.

On February 18, 2019 a yearly review of the financial transactions was conducted with no errors to report.
