a. Ministry & Evangelism – David Dubble

Our commission would like to thank Grace for her work in getting the musicians for the recent night of Gospel Music. We would also like to thank Pastor Marty for helping with the opening and closing portions of the program. Our thanks also to the Mission & Fellowship commission for providing refreshments. We feel the night was a great success. There were 114 people in attendance and the offering was \$443.25. It was distributed equally between YWAM (Youth With A Mission) and the church Sharing Cupboard.

Our commission met twice with Pastor Marty and Pete Kontra from the district to discuss the results of the survey and to implement strategies and plans to address findings from the survey. We will meet again to evaluate our progress.

Pastor Marty has given our commission dates where he would like to have a worship leader to assist with the Sunday morning service. We continue to fill those dates with members of the congregation. We want to thank those who have taken part in the Sunday morning worship service as worship leaders. We are planning on continuing this program.

The Blackwood Quartet presented a program on June 2, 2019, at 6:00 p.m. The program was open to the public and a free-will offering was taken to cover their expenses.

We discussed having the group Piercing Word present a program in the fall. They have been here before and it was well received. But, due to the increasing number of local appearances for Piercing Word, we feel it will be best to look for another option for the program.

We plan to do another night of music in spring 2020.

We are moving forward with the Music committee's suggestion to have members of the congregation provide instrumental music on a given Sunday of the month.

Our commission would like to thank Mark Landis, Jr. for being the speaker for the Easter morning Sunrise Service. It was well attended. We would also like to thank the Missions & Fellowship Commission for providing the breakfast.

Glenn Hassinger will fill the pulpit on July 7<sup>th</sup> when Pastor Marty is at Annual Conference.

Special services were planned for Memorial Day, Father's Day and Pentecost Sunday. For a future program we are considering a program based on the ministry of Billy Graham. The program is "Then Sings My Soul". Grace has found that they are available November 10 for an afternoon program. We would plan to start the program at 2 p.m. .

On May 21<sup>st</sup> Laura Hamilton joined our commission meeting. We are excitedly looking to her expertise to assist us in strengthening and growing our church.

### b. Missions & Fellowship – Susie Dundore

We started the spring season with a mission trip to the Mennonite Central Committee Work place in Ephrata. On March 30<sup>th</sup>, 15 people went on a tour of the place. Some made school kits and other cut up tee shirts for projects. Everyone had a great time.

April 21<sup>st</sup> was the Easter Sunrise Breakfast after the service at the Myerstown Park. 60 people attended. We sold tickets for \$2.00 and we collected a total of \$146.00 which will go toward Vacation Bible School expenses.

I met with Becky, the director of "Youth With A Mission" (YWAM) in Lebanon on April 28<sup>th</sup> and I did a presentation on the fire at their building on March 27<sup>th</sup>. We received brochures about the fire and a donation box is in the Gathering Place.

We collected jewelry and other items for the Londonderry Village Yard Sale on May 30<sup>th</sup>, 31<sup>st</sup> and June 1<sup>st</sup>.

Our church is presenting 5 ELCO Middle School students with the "Good Neighbor Award" on June 4<sup>th</sup>. They receive a certificate and a \$20 gift card to J.O.Y bookstore.

On Fire Ministries needs volunteers for the refreshment stand at the Grand Stand at the Lebanon Fair on July 27<sup>th</sup>, which is the night of the Demolition Derby. A sign-up sheet in the Gathering Place.
