#### THE LOVE FEAST

Question: "What is a love feast?"

**Answer:** A love feast or agape feast was a fellowship meal eaten by Christians in the early church. There is biblical evidence for the practice of these communal meals, during which Christians gathered not just for the sake of sustenance and socializing, but for the sake of fellowship (Acts 2:46–47; 1 Corinthians 11:17–34). The term love feast appears in the Bible in the book of Jude. The author of the epistle is talking about false teachers who come into the believers' fellowship, pretending—they are wolves in sheep's clothing. These false teachers are described as "blemishes at your love feasts" (Jude 1:12). The ESV calls the pretenders "hidden reefs," pointing up the dangerous nature of false teachers and their potential to shipwreck Christians.

Hippolytus of Rome and Tertullian both wrote about communal meals, though Hippolytus does not use the term agape but calls the meals simply "love feasts." In some traditions, these meals became associated with other rituals, such as the Eucharist. It is possible that the term agape feast fell out of usage because it became associated with certain abuses that were taking place during the feasts-including gluttony and favoritism, which Paul addresses in 1 Corinthians 11:17-34. However, Christians have always practiced communal meals of various kinds. Communion, or the Lord's Table, is an ordinance that Jesus gave the church, commanding that we partake of the bread and the cup in remembrance of Him. This was done in the early church at the love feasts (Luke 22:19). In the context of 1 Corinthians 11, it is clear that Paul equates communal meals with remembering Christ in this way, and that is one of the reasons why abusing the communal meal was so offensive (1 Corinthians 11:20-34).

Today, love feasts are still observed by the Moravians, Church of the Brethren, Old German Baptists, Dunkard Brethren, and some other denominations. In some cases, the fellowship includes a footwashing ceremony, a meal, and the observance of communion. Some house churches have attempted to revive the practice of the love feast, though it is not always called a love feast. Sharing a meal can have spiritual significance because of the Last Supper that Jesus ate with His disciples, where He taught them to serve one another. Food brings nourishment, and wine brings gladness (Psalm 104:15; Ecclesiastes 9:7), and they can be symbols of the free gift of Christ, who is the bread of life and the giver of joy (John 6:35; Romans 14:17).



We live in unprecedented times. It seems change is happening around us by the hour. All of us have been dealing with daily changes to our lives because of the covid19 virus, store closings, social distancing, and now for you here at Myerstown Church of the Brethren, a sudden pastoral change.

At the Church Board meeting on March 17, 2020, I was called to serve as your Interim Pastor. Ministering to a congregation in such turbulent times is necessary, but it is complicated now by those other issues which don't allow our meeting together. Our discussion at the board meeting focused partly around how I can reach out to you as we begin this journey together. Let me begin by introducing myself to you.

My name is Dennis Garrison. Ministry is a second career for me. After thirty years of teaching middle school music, most of those in the Derry Township (Hershey) School District, I "retired" to take the position of Pastor of Special Ministries at the Spring Creek Church of the Brethren in Hershey. My call to ministry began in the 1980's and led to licensing at Spring Creek in 1983 and ordination in 1990. I served in various part-time capacities before joining the staff full-time in 2002. In early 2008 I was called to the role of Senior Pastor at Spring Creek and served until my retirement on January 1, 2018. I most recently served as Interim Pastor at the Akron Church of the Brethren from August 2019-May2020. My theological training included the Atlantic Northeast District Reading Course, courses at Lancaster Seminary, Evangelical Seminary here in Myerstown, and courses through the Susquehanna Valley Ministry Center at Elizabethtown College.

My wife Cathy and I met during our freshman year at college and were married July 1, 1972. We have three grown children: Andrew who is married to Tara, Peter who is married to Katie, and Erin who lives with us. Three grandchildren and a step-granddaughter complete our family.

As I begin this journey with you as your interim pastor, I want to offer some words of encouragement and hope. In Numbers 27, God tells Moses his time as the leader of God's people is coming to an end. Moses had done the work to which God had called him and now it was time for a new leader. So Moses asked God to appoint this new leader, one who would "guide the people" that they would not be "like sheep without a shepherd."

In response, God directed Moses to lay hands on Joshua and commission him as the one who would lead the people into God's promised future. *The work of God is bigger than any one individual and any one generation.* We see that affirmed in the opening verses of the book of Joshua as God commissions Joshua for the work of leadership: "Be strong and courageous. Do not be afraid; do not be discouraged, for the LORD your God will be with you wherever you go." (Joshua 1:19 NIV) Let us not forget that God is with us each moment and each day. Live in this assurance and live in His love.

In Mark 4:35 Jesus invites his disciples, "Let us go over to the other side" of the lake. There was somewhere Jesus wanted them to go and there was something they needed to do on the other side. What they found was in that time of transition from one side of the lake to the other they would face some challenges. Times of transition and change are rarely without challenges. For the disciples that day there were two: a violent storm and something about Jesus that both amazed and confused them. Getting to the other side certainly meant the boat ride, but it also meant dealing with a torrential downpour and a dead calm. Sometimes the hardest part of the process of transition and change is accepting reality and just getting into the boat. If the disciples knew there was going to be a storm, they may never have gotten into the boat.

The storm wasn't the destination, but it was part of the pathway to the destination. And, if you read this story carefully, you notice that, while the disciples feared they might drown in the storm, what really "terrified" them was what Jesus said and what happened when he spoke. He "rebuked the wind and said to the waves, 'Quiet! Be still!' Then the wind died down and it was completely calm."

For we here at Myerstown Church of the Brethren there are two promises in this story: first is that there is something for us on the other side – some work to do, some blessing to be experienced - and Jesus wants us to go there with him. And second, that getting to the other side will have some challenges, but Jesus is with us on the journey, in the transition and will be with us on the other side.

As we move forward together I challenge you to keep these three things in mind. (1) The work of God at Myerstown Church of the Brethren is bigger than any one individual. (2) God's work is not done here. Jesus has something for us on the other side. (3) Getting to the other side will have some challenges, but Jesus is with us on the journey and will be with us on the other side.

Right now we are in the midst of the challenges. I urge you to get in the boat and begin this journey together. God has something in mind for you. Let's work together as we seek the new work God has planned for you on the other side.
