1 In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. 2 He was in the beginning with God. 3 All things came into being through him, and without him not one thing came into being. What has come into being 4 in him was life,[a] and the life was the light of all people. 5 The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it. 6 There was a man sent from God, whose name was John. 7 He came as a witness to testify to the light, so that all might believe through him. 8 He himself was not the light, but he came to testify to the light. 9 The true light, which enlightens everyone, was coming into the world.[b] 10 He was in the world, and the world came into being through him; yet the world did not know him. 11 He came to what was his own,[c] and his own people did not accept him. 12 But to all who received him, who believed in his name, he gave power to become children of God, 13 who were born, not of blood or of the will of the flesh or of the will of man, but of God, 14 And the Word became flesh and lived among us, and we have seen his glory, the glory as of a father's only son,[d] full of grace and truth. 15 (John testified to him and cried out, "This was he of whom I said, 'He who comes after me ranks ahead of me because he was before me.") 16 From his fullness we have all received, grace upon grace. 17 The law indeed was given through Moses; grace and truth came through Jesus Christ. 18 No one has ever seen God. It is God the only Son,[e] who is close to the Father's heart,[f] who has made him known.

Ministry through Faith, Vision, and Action

Typically, the first sign of the Christmas season for me has been that thick and heavy issue of the Harrisburg Patriot News that arrived at our house on Thanksgiving Day. Most of that issue was always the Black Friday ads. As we are all aware, this Christmas is going to be anything but "typical." For one, Cathy and I have cancelled our newspaper subscription, so all those ads won't be arriving on Thanksgiving Day.

Like most of you, I am growing weary of all the chaos and atypical things that 2020 has brought us. I long for some semblance of "normal." In addition to exploding cases of COVID, this Christmas season comes at a time of social upheaval, political tension and great uncertainty as to what the future holds.

Yet that is very much what the world was like on that first Christmas. The Roman empire was seeking to expand its influence and power and political tensions were high between Rome and those rebellious Jews in the province of Palestine who refused to worship the emperor. Even within Judaism there had developed parties with widely different ideas and beliefs: Pharisees, Sadducees, Zealots and the Essenes. It wasn't a "silent night" and definitely not a peaceful time in the world to which Jesus came.

That condition of humanity, that condition of the world, however, is exactly why Jesus came. Philip Yancey, in his book The Jesus I Never Knew says, "One night in the cold, in the dark, among the wrinkled hills of Bethlehem...two worlds came together at a dramatic point of intersection. God, who knows no before or after, entered time and space. God, who knows no boundaries, took on the shocking confines of a baby's skin, the ominous restraints of mortality."

God, in the person of Jesus Christ, entered this world of upheaval, of chaos and atypical things and became one of us. God became human and lived among us.

This Advent season my messages will focus on the first eighteen verses of the Gospel of John. John's opening verses are all about the coming of Jesus into the world but told in a way that does not include any of those familiar parts of the Christmas story. There is no manger, no multitudes of heavenly hosts praising God, no shepherds, no Mary and Joseph. What John does give us, however, is one of Scripture's most profound statements of who Jesus is and why he came into the world.

"In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God. ...What has come into being in him was life, and the life was the light of all people. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not

overcome it. ...And the Word became flesh and lived among us, and we have seen his glory, the glory as of a father's only son, full of grace and truth." (John 1:1-2, 3b-5, 14 NRSV)

Two-thousand years ago Jesus, the Word, came into a chaotic, unpredictable and often violent world, not unlike the world today. Jesus became human and lived among us. Into a dark and fearful world Jesus brought life and light. He brought hope, a new kind of peace, the possibility for joy and a message of love. In two-thousand years the message has not changed.

As we face a different, atypical kind of Christmas, let us remember that the reason for our celebration has not changed. Jesus' message of hope, peace, joy and love is the message we need right now. Let's choose not to focus on the things that are atypical, inconvenient and disappointing about Christmas 2020 and choose to focus instead on the unchanging story of the One who came into the world "full of grace and truth." Let us choose to focus on the glory he has revealed to us. Let us choose to find some hope, peace, joy and love this Christmas season.

What better way for us to end this chaotic year than to celebrate Jesus, the light that has come into our darkness, a darkness that, even in 2020, cannot overcome his amazing light. May you have a blessed and joyous Christmas because of Jesus who lives among us even today.

Pastor's Report

I am sure most of us are aware of the significant increase in COVID cases in our area and in the nation within the past month. Prior to this past week, Cathy and I knew of a few people who were dealing with the virus, but our family had been spared. Then I got a call on Monday the 16th that my mother had tested positive and was being moved from the Royer Greenhouse at Londonderry Village to Leffler Care. It has been a privilege and a joy to serve as your interim pastor these past eight months. I look forward to continuing in this role as long as you need/want me. Your support for the church and your efforts to keep it moving forward are greatly appreciated. There have been some stories this past week offering hope that we may be turning the corner to more "normal" times by mid-2021. Let's hope and pray that will be so.

As we come into the holiday season, I pray you will be safe and be blessed.
