Lament: The Language of Humility

You may recall from last month's newsletter article that I will be sharing thoughts on the book of Lamentations during these months of Lent. Recall from the first message that the book of Lamentations addresses one specific moment in Jewish history, the exile of the Israelite people to Babylon and the destruction of the city of Jerusalem, a disaster of catastrophic proportions for God's people.

As the name of the book suggests, Lamentations is a lament, Jeremiah's crying out to God over this unimaginable situation.

Lament is a form of prayer that arises out of great need, out of loss, and out of suffering. Lament recognizes the struggles of life. Lament deals with reality. Lament is honesty before God. Lament encompasses an attitude of humility before God and before others. Lament is the language of humility.

Kathleen O'Connor, in her book, Lamentations and the Tears of the World, writes, "Laments are prayers of the disoriented, the disturbed, and the distraught...But remarkably, in the process of harsh complaint and resistance, they also express faith in God in the midst of chaos, doubt and confusion..."

It is in this sense that lament encompasses humility. In lamenting, I recognize who I am. Through lament, I'm honest before God about what it is that is disorienting, disturbing and distressing me while, in the midst of it all, I humble myself before God and recognize God's sovereignty. In Lamentations 2 God takes center stage. Jeremiah laments God has brought his judgment on Jerusalem and the Israelite people. In verses 1-8 Jeremiah says God did it: "The Lord has scorned his altar, disowned his sanctuary; he has delivered into the hand of the enemy the walls of her palaces...." (Lamentations 2:7 NRSV)

In verses 9-16 Jeremiah describes the scene in Jerusalem: in verse 9, "Jerusalem's gates have sunk into the ground...her kings and princes have been exiled to distant lands...her prophets receive no more visions from the Lord." In verses 11-12, Jerusalem's children are starving and dying in the streets. In verse 14, false prophets said foolish things, painted false pictures and filled the people with false hope.

In verse 17 Jeremiah acknowledges God's sovereignty: "...it is the Lord who did just as he planned. He has fulfilled the promises of disaster he made long ago." Jeremiah was referring to God's promises of both blessings and curses found in Deuteronomy 11 and 28. The Lord did "just as he planned."

What happened to Jerusalem, what God had done was not done capriciously, but instead God's actions revealed God's sovereignty, God's constancy and God's integrity in faithfulness to his words and to the covenant he made with his people.

Lament encompasses humility because it acknowledges God's sovereignty. Lament recognizes that God is in control. But in recognizing God's sovereignty, lament also expresses the assurance that the God who is the righteous judge is also the God of mercy who will bring redemption and restoration and will expand his reign over all of human history. "... acknowledgement of [God's] sovereignty should free those of us who put our trust in God to not put ourselves in the place of God." (Soong-Chan Rah, Prophetic Lament: A Call for Justice in Troubled Times, ©2015 Soong-Chan Rah, pub. IVP Books, p.77)

In an article in Christianity Today, Dave Goetz tells the following story of a lesson he learned about humility. He savs:

"On a fly-fishing trip, with still an hour in the truck before arriving home my fishing buddy off-handedly observed that I was overly sensitive to criticism. He listed a couple of instances, including my response to some reviews of my writing. Suddenly, the truck felt cramped. I snapped back that simply debating what others say about me or what I do isn't being overly sensitive. I asked him to give more specific examples, which I debunked. Hurt, I withdrew from the conversation and nursed my new wound from an old friend. How could I be sensitive to criticism?

In the years since, I've come slowly to another layer of insight: Not only am I oversensitive to criticism, I'm also likely to play consultant to others about how they can advance their lives. ... [In the past], I saw myself as much more large-hearted I now see why humility comes on the heels of self-knowledge: I cringe when I think of how unaware I've been."

Goetz goes on to caution that this kind of honest self-knowledge which leads to humility isn't acquired in one lesson. "It's a slow, agonizing progression as the soul makes its way toward God."

"...humility comes on the heels of self-knowledge..." Jeremiah expresses this "self-knowledge," his realization as to why Jerusalem is in shambles: "the Lord...did just as he planned."

God said destruction and exile would come if the people disobeyed. They disobeyed and that is what happened. Knowing why, he cries until the tears no longer come; he calls the people to rise in the night lifting their hands in prayer, pleading for their children. In his lament Jeremiah humbles himself before God.

Dave Goetz never thought he was sensitive to criticism. But over time realized he was not only sensitive to criticism, but also was critical of others. He was "likely to play consultant to others" as he put it. What he saw as being "large-hearted," was, in reality, exhibiting a similar kind of pride the Israelites exhibited.

C.S. Lewis said the opposite of humility is pride, that "humility is not thinking less of yourself, but thinking of yourself less," or as Paul put it in Romans 12:3, not thinking of ourselves more highly than we ought. We need to be careful to not see humility as self-deprecation.

Humility is not to think lowly of yourself, but rather to appreciate who God has made you to be while at the same time recognizing your fallen nature.

This is the kind of self-knowledge which enables us to come humbly before our creator: realizing who God has made us to be; realizing we are precious in his sight, that we are loved, but at the same time realizing our fallen nature. It's all part of that slow, agonizing progression of the soul making its way toward God. This is a kind of humility that is expressed never more powerfully than in the prayer of lament.

Proverbs 3:34 says, "God opposes the proud, but gives grace to the humble." James invites us to "humble [ourselves] before God. ...Come close to God, and God will come close to [us]. Wash [our] hands...purify [our] hearts...to humble [ourselves] before the Lord, and he will lift [us] up...." (James 4:7-10 NLT)

To lament, to come humbly before God, is to be vulnerable before God; to come with tears; to come with our fears, our hurts, with what distresses and disturbs us; to come and let God gather us under his wings. What in your life today has you disoriented, disturbed, and distraught? Cry out to God. Humble yourself before Him; be honest about who you are and who God is. And as you cry out, be assured that God is in the midst of the chaos, the doubt and the confusion..." God wants you to come, to come humbly, to cry out and receive his grace.

Kreider and Snowden Lectures via Zoom Kreider Fellow Samuel Dali and Snowden Fellow Rebecca Dali will share stories of pain and hope from the Boko Haram crisis and the church's response. In our Ephesians Bible study this past Monday, Donna Ritchey Martin, the author of the book we are using, told the story of a pastor who began serving in a congregation that had gone through some tough times. Thank you for not telling me all those stories about Myerstown CoB! The story concluded with the pastor sharing this statement: "...by concentrating on the work of the church instead of past problems, the church was strengthened, and God was glorified." That is what we have been trying to do together for the past year here at Myerstown CoB — concentrating on the work of the church instead of past problems.

Francis Foulkes, in his commentary on Ephesians says, "...unity is not a matter of organization, but of sharing of the common life and tasks of the body...." As we move into a second year together, let us work to achieve this kind of unity as we work together to strengthen our common life and attend to the tasks God to which God calls us.
