### Scriptural Message

16 The Lord said to Samuel, "How long will you grieve over Saul? I have rejected him from being king over Israel. Fill your horn with oil and set out: I will send you to Jesse the Bethlehem-ite, for I have provided for myself a king among his sons." 2 Samuel said, "How can I go? If Saul hears of it, he will kill me." And the Lord said, "Take a heifer with you, and say, 'I have come to sacrifice to the Lord.' 3 Invite Jesse to the sacrifice, and I will show you what you shall do; and you shall anoint for me the one whom I name to vou." 4 Samuel did what the Lord commanded, and came to Bethlehem. The elders of the city came to meet him trembling, and said, "Do you come peaceably?" 5 He said, "Peaceably; I have come to sacrifice to the Lord; sanctify yourselves and come with me to the sacrifice.' And he sanctified Jesse and his sons and invited them to the sacrifice. 6 When they came, he looked on Eliab and thought, "Surely the Lord's anointed is now before the Lord."[a] 7 But the Lord said to Samuel, "Do not look on his appearance or on the height of his stature, because I have rejected him; for the Lord does not see as mortals see: they look on the outward appearance, but the Lord looks on the heart." 8 Then Jesse called Abinadab, and made him pass before Samuel. He said, "Neither has the Lord chosen this one." 9 Then Jesse made Shammah pass by. And he said, "Neither has the Lord chosen this one." 10 Jesse made seven of his sons pass before Samuel, and Samuel said to Jesse, "The Lord has not chosen any of these." 11 Samuel said to Jesse, "Are all your sons here?" And he said, "There remains yet the youngest, but he is keeping the sheep." And Samuel said to Jesse, "Send and bring him; for we will not sit down until he comes here." 12 He sent and brought him in. Now he was ruddy, and had beautiful eyes, and was handsome. The Lord said, "Rise and anoint him; for this is the one." 1 Samuel 16:1-12 (NRSV)

#### This is the One

I am sure many of you parents of grown children have fond memories of special times spent with your children when they were young. One of my fondest memories is of the bed-time stories. It was usually my job to read the bed-time story and the three children would snuggle close as I read.

We had a Bible story book that was a favorite and I would often ask them which story they would like me to read. Often it was the story of the anointing of David as king found in 1 Samuel 16. I'm not sure what it was about this story that caught their interest, but we read it often. Come to think of it, this is one of my favorite Old Testament stories as well. Maybe that's because I read it so often! At the Christian Education Commission meeting on April 20, we had a discussion about some needs in the church's Sunday School program and it got me thinking about this Bible story. Let me share a little about the Scripture and why it connects to the discussion we had at Christian Ed. First, a little background on David's story. To understand how David became Israel's second king, we need to go back to the story of the first king, Saul. Up until the time when Saul became king, Israel had been governed by judges, the most well-known being Samuel. You can read of God's call to Samuel in 1 Samuel 3.

As Samuel aged, he appointed his sons to be judges over Israel and, let's just say they were not a chop off the old block. So, the people came to Samuel and asked him to appoint for them a king (1 Samuel 8:5). Samuel wasn't happy with their request, but God told him to honor it and he did so, but only after warning the people how a king would treat them – putting their sons in his armies, taking their daughters to serve in his court, taking their land to give to his officials, and taking a tenth of their harvests, flocks and herds. In 1 Samuel 9 we meet Saul who Samuel anoints as Israel's first king. The Scripture describes Saul as "the most handsome man in Israel – head and shoulders taller than anyone else in the land." (1 Samuel 9:2)

As we read on in 1 Samuel, we find several instances where Saul blatantly disobeys God and in chapter 13 Samuel tells Saul, "...your kingdom must end, for the Lord has sought out a man after his own heart. The Lord has already appointed him to be the leader of his people because you have not kept the Lord's command." Samuel's work was not done. God instructed him to go to Bethlehem and find a man named Jesse. God had chosen one of Jesse's sons to be the next king. Samuel was reluctant to go, afraid that Saul, while still the king, would hear about him anointing a new king and would kill him.

Interestingly, God comes up with a little ruse to protect Samuel. He is to take a heifer and say he came to make a sacrifice to the Lord. He should invite Jesse and his sons to join him and God would then reveal which of the sons Samuel is to anoint as the new king. Jesse and his sons aren't too sure about Samuel either, but they agree to join Samuel for the sacrifice. When they arrive for the

sacrifice, Samuel first sees Eliab and is sure he must be the one. Then we are given what is one of the Bible's most important lessons: "Don't judge by his appearance or height, for I have rejected him. The Lord doesn't see things the way you see them. People judge by outward appearance, but the Lord looks at the heart." And so it goes. Samuel looks over the sons, one by one, and each time God tells him this is not the one. Finally, Samuel asks if these are all of Jesse's sons. No, they were not all the sons. The youngest, David, was out tending the sheep. Samuel asked them to bring David to him. Now, a little interesting twist in this story. God just got done telling Samuel that outward appearance isn't important to God, but what is the first thing the writer tells us about David? "He was dark and handsome, with beautiful eyes."

Nevertheless, David was the one so Samuel anointed him and "the Spirit of the Lord came powerfully upon David from that day on." (1 Samuel 16:13)

What was it that God saw in David that neither his father, nor his brothers, nor Samuel was able to see? God saw David's heart.

So, now for the connection of this Scripture to the Christian Ed Commission meeting. We need some people with a heart for teaching, both adults and children to step up and "be the one." Those who have stepped up are doing a fantastic job, but we need some others to step up and "be the one."

In spite of COVID, God has blessed this church. We are at the point of looking ahead rather than looking back, and essential to moving ahead is developing our Christian Education programs, especially for the children and youth of the church.

We have a good group of younger children, but we also have a number of the beginnings of a youth program with a number of younger youth. Right now, with only one class the age range makes focused teaching difficult. We need to start a class for middle school aged youth. Might you "be the one" (or two or three) to help us get a program going again for these youth?

Adults have different preferences for learning, some like lecture while others prefer video lessons or discussion groups. We would like to offer at least one other type of adult class, but we need volunteers to step up and "be the one" (or two or three).

So, what about you? Are you "the one?"

Give this some thought and prayer and, if you sense God calling you to "be the one," let me or one of the members of the Christian Education Commission know (Christine Blackwell, Brenda Lentz, Walter and Cindy Sattazahn).
