Faith, Vision, and Action

I don't know how this summer has been for you, but for Cathy and I it has gone by in a flash. Between the arrival of twin grand-daughters in July and the visit to our oldest son's family in the Netherlands for two weeks in August we've been quite busy and it is hard to believe summer is just about over. With turning the calendar to September, school starting, football season getting underway, and seeing a few trees already showing some color, the signs are all there. Summer is just about over.

I have always called south central Pennsylvania home and so the changing of seasons is something I have come to accept and to enjoy. I can't imagine not experiencing the colors of fall, gently falling snow in winter, the anticipation of the first flowers of spring, and the outdoor activities of summer. The change of seasons for me is a reminder of God's continual care and involvement in creation. The change of seasons reminds me of God's promise to Noah following the flood, "As long as the earth endures, seedtime and harvest, cold and heat, summer and winter, day and night, shall not cease."

In Ecclesiastes 3:1 (NRSV) Solomon says, "For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven." In the introduction to the book of Ecclesiastes in the NIV Study Bible the editor writes, "In this profound book, Solomon takes us on a mental journey through his life, explaining how everything he tried, tested, or tasted was 'meaningless.... After this biographical tour, Solomon made his triumphant conclusion: 'Fear God and keep his commandments, for this is the whole duty of man.' ...Near the end of his life, Solomon looked back with an attitude of humility and repentance."

Solomon, like every one of us, went through some seasons in his life, some he wished he had lived differently, some he wasn't proud of, but seasons that in the end pointed him to the most important lesson he learned through it all - "Fear God and keep his commandments...."

Here at Myerstown Church of the Brethren you have gone through some seasons in your life together, some you may wish you had lived differently and some of which you might not be proud. You've gone through a season of testing and of discerning of who you are together in this local body - a part of Christ's body. And now you are about to enter a new season, a season again of searching for new pastoral leadership. Understandably, you enter into this season with some ambivalence.

Like Solomon did, you will probably reflect on the past and some of the lessons you learned. It is my prayer that you, like Solomon, will enter this new season trusting that God is with you as God has been with you in all those seasons past even when it may not have seemed like it. God was and is with you.

Just as we experience changes in the world around us as the seasons move from one to the next - the corn fields turning from green to brown, the temperatures getting cooler or warmer - so also as you enter into a new season of your life together as a congregation there will be some changes. In the midst of this season of change remember, "For I the Lord do not change..." (Malachi 3:6a NRSV) and "Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever." (Hebrews 13:8 NRSV)

There is a season and a time for every matter under heaven. The time is here for a search for new pastoral leadership here at Myerstown Church of the Brethren. As you enter this new season in your life together, trust that the God who does not change, that the Lord who is the same yesterday, today and forever, is with you.
