Ok, be honest with me now: how many of you can truthfully say you are always joyful, you never stop praying, and you give God thanks in all of your life's circumstances? Speaking for myself, I have to confess I can't answer "yes" to any parts of that question.

After all, life happens and we just don't always feel joyful. It seems hypocritical of us to "put on a happy face" when we're really hurting inside. And we can't spend all of our time on our knees in prayer. After all, we have responsibilities and things we have to do just to make it through each day. There are things that happen in our lives when we would rather be asking God to explain to us "why" rather than to give thanks. It just goes against our natural inclinations to be joyful and thankful and praying all the time. But then, a good bit of what the Bible says goes against our natural inclinations.

Sometimes simplifying texts like these two from 1 Thessalonians and Philippians helps us to both understand and remember them better. So, I offer this simplified version which I think includes both power and poetry: "Anxious in nothing, prayerful in everything, thankful in all things...then peace." When these three attitudes guide our lives, then the "peace of God" can settle quietly over our hearts and minds.

We are entering that time of year when the "peace of God" is something we hear much about, but often wonder how we're possibly going to experience it with all the activity and to-do lists of the season. Paul's words in these two Scriptures provide for us an antidote to all the craziness.

First, anxious in nothing. Frances Willard, the great temperance leader, once remarked that "anxiety is atheistical!" To be constantly anxious suggests that we don't quite trust.

What makes us anxious is that we no longer feel we have control over the situations we are facing. No matter how many extra precautions we try to take or how well we think we have done everything in our power to avoid the pain of the unexpected, deep down we still know that there is a lot about life which is out of our control. Kids grow up, illnesses come without warning, companies merge and lay off workers, investments can lose a lot more quickly than they gain. If we let our anxieties over the uncontrollable things in life rule us, we become incapable of becoming agents of God's grace in the world. How can we "rejoice" and witness to the "joy of the Lord" if we are anxiety-ridden ourselves? Be anxious in nothing because God is God today, tomorrow and always.

Second, prayerful in everything. When confronted with an unexpected grace or an unforeseen groan, is your first response to turn towards God in prayer? Paul recognizes that a good percentage of our prayers are "petitions" or "requests." Sometimes, when we are feeling spiritually strong and centered, our souls do turn toward God in deeper prayer seeking His holy presence. Other times, we approach God on our knees when our spirits are dried up and dragging. We come admitting our own inadequacies and recognizing that God is the sole source of all wholeness.

God desires our prayers, petitions and requests. God wants to be vitally present in our lives. Being prayerful in all circumstances acknowledges our dependence on God and recognizes His presence with us at all times.

Third, thankful in all things. Notice, Paul didn't say thankful for all things, but rather, thankful in all things. Even when difficult things come our way, we can thank God for His presence with us as we walk through that dark valley and in anticipation of the good, He may have in store for us at the end of the walk. That is the reason we can be thankful in all things. Our thankfulness is not a matter of putting on that happy face. It is based in the confidence that whatever comes our way, our life is built on a foundation of power through faith in the resurrected Christ.

Then peace. It is "in Christ" Paul insists that we will finally experience this miraculous gift of the "peace of God." As long as we are in Christ, the peace of God will guard our hearts and guide our minds; we'll pull the pieces of our lives together and we will experience that "peace which passes understanding!

Remember: Anxious in nothing, prayerful in everything, thankful in all things...then peace.
