Ministry through Faith, Vision, and Action

The month of January has been cold and a bit snowy. I'm sure, like me, many of you are looking forward to spring. Well, January is behind us and February is here so we can hope for longer and warmer days. For me, February brings back memories of days back in elementary school when we exchanged Valentine's Day cards, when we made paper stove-top hats recalling the one worn by President Abraham Lincoln, and making three-point hats and paper hatchets recalling the story of George Washington cutting down a cherry tree.

The stories of those two presidents seem to have been lost as President's Day now recognizes all presidents, but Valentine's Day is still popular and recognized with cards, flowers and thoughts of love. I thought it might be interesting to learn a little about the Christian saint after whom Valentine's Day is named. I found the following information in an article about St. Valentine on Wikipedia.

"Saint Valentine was a priest of Rome or the former Bishop of Terni, an important town of Umbria, in central Italy. While under house arrest of Judge Asterius, and discussing his faith with him, Valentinus (the Latin version of his name) was discussing the validity of Jesus. The judge put Valentinus to the test and brought to him the judge's adopted blind daughter. If Valentinus succeeded in restoring the girl's sight, Asterius would do whatever he asked. Valentinus, praying to God, laid his hands on her eyes and the child's vision was restored.

Immediately humbled, the judge asked Valentinus what he should do. Valentinus replied that all of the idols around the judge's house should be broken, and that the judge should fast for three days and then undergo the Christian sacrament of baptism. The judge obeyed and, as a result of his fasting and prayer, freed all the Christian inmates under his authority. The judge, his family, and his forty-four-member household of adult family members and servants were baptized.

Valentinus was later arrested again for continuing to evangelize and was sent to the emperor Claudius Gothicus (Claudius II) himself. Claudius took a liking to him until Valentinus tried to convince Claudius to embrace Christianity, whereupon Claudius refused and condemned Valentinus to death, commanding that Valentinus either renounce his faith or he would be beaten with clubs and beheaded. Valentinus refused and Claudius' command was executed outside the Flaminian Gate February 14, 269.

Saint Valentine is said to have ministered to the faithful Christians undergoing persecution in the Roman Empire. One account says that before his execution, Saint Valentine wrote a note to Asterius's

daughter signed "from your Valentine", which is said to have "inspired today's romantic missives."

"There are many other legends behind Saint Valentine. One is that Valentine defied the order of the emperor Claudius and secretly performed Christian weddings for couples, allowing the husbands involved to escape conscription into the pagan army. This legend claims that soldiers were sparse at this time so this was a big inconvenience to the emperor. The account mentions that in order 'to remind these men of their vows and God's love, Saint Valentine is said to have cut hearts from parchment', giving them to these persecuted Christians, a possible origin of the widespread use of hearts on St. Valentine's Day.

Saint Valentine of Rome was martyred on February 14 in AD 269. The Feast of Saint Valentine, also known as Saint Valentine's Day, was established by Pope Gelasius I in AD 496 to be celebrated on February 14 in honor of the Christian martyr." (https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Saint-Valentine)

Although Saint Valentine's Day has become focused on romantic love, it seems that the real St. Valentine knew God's love, a love that led him to seek to bring others to a knowledge of Christ and God's love revealed in Christ. He lived that kind of love. His faithfulness and his example of Christian love should inspire us as we remember him on February 14.
