Mother's in the Bible

For me, the month of May brings to mind several things including May flowers, my paternal grandmother's birthday (she would have been 107 this year) and, of course, Mother's Day. I am fortunate to still have my mother. She is 93 and generally in good health. My brother and I will honor her with a visit and some flowers on Mother's Day.

I grew up next door to my paternal grandparents and have numerous memories of those times I would go next door and just walk in. My grandmother, Gerty, would often make me some "dippy eggs" on those occasions. She made the best home-made lemonade and shoofly pies. One lasting memory is those times I would drop by in the evenings and find her and my grandfather sitting around the kitchen table for their evening devotions.

I am sure many of you have fond memories of mothers and grandmothers as well. Sadly, not all of us have such memories of our mothers. As Cathy and I have spent time with our son, daughter-in-law and twin granddaughters, it has just reminded us again of how motherhood is both a blessing and a challenge. Often, we have remarked how difficult it was with one baby at a time and how we admire how Katie is doing with two! (Peter too, but he works long hours and Katie is home alone with the girls much of the time.)
