As we enter into a new season of the year and into a new season in the life of Myerstown Church of the Brethren, there are some uncertainties, but also there is much of which we can be certain and will carry us through times of uncertainty.

We can be certain that, "As long as the earth endures, seedtime and harvest, cold and heat, summer and winter, day and night will never cease." And we can be certain that "Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever." God is in control of the future and Jesus Christ is Lord of yesterday, today and tomorrow, therefore we need not fear. "For everything there is a season" tells us that there are things of which we must let go, there are new things which we can anticipate and engage, and there are things which are unchangeable which will enable us to face the future with courage and hope.
