Gifts to immigrant legal and mutual aid fund top \$44,000

A Legal and Mutual Aid Fund supporting immigrant Church of the Brethren members and families affected by detention and deportation has received \$44,830 in donations as of Sept. 23. The fund aids the Deportation Defense Response initiative created by four Church of the Brethren districts with the Intercultural Ministries office and On Earth Peace.

The donations have been put to work immediately and grants have been made to 18 individuals and families. The grants of between \$1,500 to \$2,500 help cover legal expenses, application and form fees (such as asylum, work permits, religious work permits), and mutual aid (such as rent, food, and supplies). All grants are applied for and distributed through local congregations.

Other Church of the Brethren funds give grants

Emergency Disaster Fund grants:

- \$25,000 supports the Deportation Defense Response Team and the Legal and Mutual Aid Fund.
- \$33,000 supports the Brethren Disaster Ministries response to Hurricane Helene, helping to fund a new partnership in eastern Tennessee with International Orthodox Christian Charities. Brethren Disaster Ministries volunteers are working with the Johnson County Long Term Recovery Group from Sept. 21 to Nov. 15, based in Mountain City, Tenn.

Global Food Initiative grants:

- \$2,500 supports Ellisforde (Wash.)

Church of the Brethren's work with the Tonasket Emergency Food Bank.


- \$2,500 supports Akron (Ohio) First Church of the Brethren's Community Blessing Box.

Brethren Faith in Action grants:

- \$5,000 supports the Gun Buy Back Program of Spirit of Peace Church of the Brethren in Lansing, Mich. The grant helped purchase handguns and rifles for destruction by the Lansing Police and Ingham County Sheriff's Office on Oct. 18.
- \$5,000 supports Sunnyslope Church, a joint Church of the Brethren and United Church of Christ congregation,

increase hospitality through a technology update and purchase of equipment for Packing Friendship, kitchen essentials, and resources for children's programs.

- \$5,000 supports the WildWood Gathering Church of the Brethren to develop a retreat to deepen relationships and strengthen community culture.
- \$3,639.75 supports Prince of Peace Church of the Brethren's marketing and community outreach through Facebook ads, yard signs, an espresso ministry, and interaction with the local elementary school.

Tanzania hosts peace conference

A Church of the Brethren peace conference held Aug. 15-17 in Mwanza, Tanzania, brought together church leaders as potters of hope, molding visions of *amani* (peace) and *tumaini* (hope) into forms that can serve their communities.

The emerging Church of the Brethren in Tanzania hosted the conference and its bishop, Rhobinson Baiye, asked two Church of the Brethren denominational staff—Jennifer Hosler, manager of the Global Food Initiative, and Nathan Hosler, director of the Office of Peacebuilding and Policy—to lead the teaching.

Other church leaders provided support and added teachings related

to their African contexts including Bwambale Sedrack, national director of the Church of Brethren in Uganda; Expert Bukene, bishop of the Church of the Brethren in Burundi; and Esther and Amos Muhagachi from the Mennonite Church in Tanzania.

Sedrack said the conference offered “vital lessons to Uganda, which continues to wrestle with legacies of past conflicts while facing new pressures of political polarization, migration, climate change, economic inequality, youth unemployment, and violent extremism.” What became clear to him is that “peace cannot be imposed from above; instead, it is cultivated within church communities.”
